TITLE: A RESOLUTION URGING THE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES TO REQUIRE LANDLINE AND WIRELESS TELEPHONE SERVICE UTILITIES TO IMPLEMENT THE NECESSARY TECHNOLOGY TO BLOCK ROBOCALLS TO THEIR CUSTOMERS, FREE OF CHARGE, AND TO ENACT REGULATIONS TO PREVENT ROBOCALLS FROM REACHING CUSTOMERS

WHEREAS, A "robocall" is a telephone call often placed by telemarketers who use a computerized auto dialer to deliver a pre-recorded message; and

WHEREAS "Telephone scammers" are individuals or groups that make unsolicited phone calls to individuals with the purpose of stealing money or personal information. Scams may come through phone calls from real people, robocalls, or text messages. The Scammers often make false promises, such as opportunities to buy products, invest money, or receive free product trials. Scammers may also offer money through free grants and lotteries. Some scammers call pretending to be from government agencies, such as the IRS with threats of jail or lawsuits if they are not paid; and

WHEREAS, "Neighbor spoofing", otherwise known as "NPA-NXX spoofing", is a form of caller ID fraud used by telemarketers, scammers, and robocallers. "Neighbor spoofing" uses auto-dialing and VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol) services to send unsolicited phone calls. These calls have an outgoing Caller ID that closely matches your area code and phone number. By mimicking their caller ID as closely as possible to the phone number they are placing the call to, spammers can trick more of their targets into answering the phone. This strategy ultimately increases the odds spammers will successfully get victims to give up personal information scammers can use to steal; and

WHEREAS, Under federal law, written consent is required for all robocalls or texts made to a wireless telephone number; further, telemarketers have never been permitted to make robocalls to a wireless telephone number based solely on an "established business relationship" with the customer; and

WHEREAS, Robocalls and Scammer calls have increased in recent years because new technology has made it cheaper and easier for telemarketers and Scammers to make calls from anywhere in the world while hiding their identities by displaying fake caller identification information by using, among other devious tactics, "Neighbor spoofing"; and

WHEREAS, most telephone users consider robocalls and scammer calls to be a nuisance and disruptive and are frustrated with their inability to stop scam or robocalls; and

WHEREAS, Scammer calls in particular place unknowing individuals of our community in peril of economic and emotional hardship; and

WHEREAS, While New Jersey and other states have enacted laws to curtail unwanted scammer and telemarketing calls including robocalls, enforcing these laws has proven difficult as many of the unwanted telemarketing and scammer calls originate outof-state or from foreign countries; and

WHEREAS, There is technology available that could block scammer and robocalls from reaching customers; and

WHEREAS, Landline and wireless telephone service providers are, for the most part, Public Utilities and within the governing purview of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities; and

WHEREAS, Landline and wireless telephone service providers can implement the necessary technology that would block robocalls from reaching customers; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities should enact the necessary regulations to require landline and wireless telephone service providers to block robocalls from reaching their customers.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Northvale that the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities is to respectfully urge landline and wireless telephone service providers to implement the necessary technology to block scam and robocalls to their customers, free of charge, and to enact regulations to prevent scam and robocalls from reaching customers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED Copies of this resolution, shall be sent to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and to Northvale's Representatives in the New Jersey State Senate and House.

PUBLIC HEARING -

HEARING OF THE PUBLIC –

<u>Rich Goddin – 418 West Avenue –</u> had questions with regard to the postings on the Borough website. He stated that it doesn't appear that the financial statements are up to date. The Borough Clerk stated that some of the documents are filed directly with the State Division of Local Government Services. Mr. Goddin commented that it looks incomplete. He further questioned what is happening with CSX and that he would like to see it done. He stated that someone made the suggestion to call Senator Weinberg to find out what was going on. Mayor Marana stated that he and the Borough Engineer had a conference call with Senator Weinbergs staff members and they stated that there was little that she could do on the state level. Railroad regulation is much more of a federal issue. Mayor Marana stated that he has also had telephone and email contact with both Corey Booker's and Josh Gottheimer's offices. Both stated that they would contact CSX engineering in an attempt to get things going. Mr. Goddin thought that perhaps this issue should be brought to the attention of the newspapers as this is a big issue.

Mr. Goddin further asked about the certified public works certificate as this was something that he brought up at the last meeting. He wanted to know if the Borough Engineer is holding the CPWM license. Mr. O'Brien stated that he does hold the license, but that this is a function of the Department of Public Works. Mr. Goddin further asked about the third party survey of the DPW. He stated that he would like to OPRA the document. He asked if the survey addressed staffing in the DPW and Mayor Marana stated that the survey found that staffing was heavy in the management area, but that has since been corrected. Mr. Goddin also asked for an update on the Clinton Avenue property and the status of Petrillo Deli's portion of the streetscape project. Mr. O'Brien stated that the streetscape in front of Petrillo's Deli is done already and that it was done with a grant.

<u>Jennifer Kelemen – Librarian – Northvale Public Library -</u> thanked Mayor Marana for the Proclamation for National Library Week. She stated that she would like to see everyone utilize the library and that they are all willing to work to help anyone who needs it.

<u>Paul Bazela – 165 Washington Street -</u> Stated he would not like to see time limits on the public comments as was previously discussed. He stated that the time limit would prohibit the public from speaking their minds and that the residents have a right to speak.

<u>Daryl George – 405 Johned Road -</u> Thanked the Mayor and Council for the Proclamation on Library Week. She also stated that she is also a member of the school board. She asked that the Mayor and Council limit the time of people speaking at the meeting. She further stated that she appreciates social media and that she also appreciated the "robocall" that went out by the Mayor on the grass collection.

<u>John Saunier – 174 Washington Street</u> - Stated that he prepared a letter for the Mayor and Council with regard to the work that he had done on the ambulance on his own time. He handed the letter to the Mayor and Mayor Marana thanked him for the work that he did on the vehicle.

<u>Susan DePalma – 196 Lambert Avenue -</u> Wanted to know if the Construction Department Technical Assistant position had been posted. Mayor Marana explained that the position had not yet been posted/advertised. Mayor Marana further explained that the next step would be for the Personnel Committee to meet and to determine if the position would be filled internally or externally.

Bill Bauer - 216 Washington Street - Asked if the Borough Attorney is representing the town in the lawsuit brought by a resident in the Borough. He stated that it was stated at a hearing that Mr. Carlomagno was 45 days too late in filing his suit. He asked if this is being put off so that the Borough Attorney can bill the town more? He asked if the Mayor and Council voted at a meeting to have the Borough Attorney represent the town and it was stated that it was. He stated that he will be at Borough Hall tomorrow to file an OPRA request for that resolution. He asked why did the Mayor and Council disregard what the zoning/planning board had put in the developers agreement with regard to the property. He further stated that he thought that it was illegal to sell the property without an Ordinance. Ms. Rosendahl stated that Mr. Bauer can make his comments with regard to this issue, but that the Mayor and Council will not be able to speak on this issue as it is a litigation matter. Mr. Bauer wanted to know when the Mayor and Council will be able to speak on the matter and where is the money coming from to defend this case. He further stated that when the property is built on there will be 100% run-off. He stated that there will have to be some kind of holding tank to hold the water. He feels that this is something that should be looked at.

There being no further comments or questions from the public; Mayor Marana closed the meeting to the public at this time.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS -

<u>Councilman Sotiropoulos</u> - Reported on the Ambulance Corps statistics for this past month. He spoke with regard to the Cho Dae golf outing. It is May13, 2019 at 7PM. He further reported that Police Chief Essmann is retiring his last day will be June 1st of this year. He stated that he met with the DPW and with recreation to help to get the fields ready for opening day. He further reported that they met with Anthony at the school and they will work with the town to work on the fields at the school. Norwood lent their

chipper to the Borough recently and the DPW was able to take care of all the chipping in one day. Macadam plants are now open so the DPW is working on the potholes. Paramus started picking up the grass and they do the entire town in ½ day. He stated that so far it is working great.

<u>Councilman McGuire</u> – Reported that Saturday is lunch with Peter Cottontail. He reported that Town Day is on track for this year. He reported that the school issued a preliminary budget and that they will be having a budget hearing on April 29th. He stated that the board passed some resolutions that were of importance to them. He stated that the Spring musical was the end of March and that April 4th is kindergarten round up and next week is the school break. May is the spring concert. He stated that he is working with the school to finalize an agreement for shared services.

<u>Councilman Argiro</u> – Stated that there aren't enough good things that can't be said about the Library and he was glad that they were here for the proclamation. He stated that they do very well and he congratulated them on the work that they do. There is a recreation meeting at the school this evening so that the parents can be introduced to the department heads and what to expect from recreation, especially the rules and regulations for children to play. Opening day is 4/27, there will be a pancake breakfast at Applebees as a fund raiser. He further reported that baseball and softball will work with the DPW to keep the fields up to date.

<u>Councilman Small</u> – Reported on the activities at the Senior Center for the past month. He reported that the Bergen County Clerk's Office will be at the Center for three days next week offering services to the seniors and the general public. He further reported that there will be a student working at the center this spring and he will be mentored by Ms. Carpanini.

<u>**Councilman Shepard**</u> – Reported on the Fire Prevention statistics for the past month and that the Fire chief is working on a grant for new radios and the new windows have been installed in the Borough Hall.

<u>Councilman DeLisio</u> - Reported on the planning/zoning meeting last week. He stated that they denied an application for a large multi family dwelling on Livingston Street. He said that it was a very interesting meeting. He stated that there was a lot of testimony by professionals, but it was determined that it was not in the best interest of Northvale.

<u>Mayor Marana</u> – Reported that the Grant Writer has submitted an Open Space Grant for a canopy at the Senior Center and that we are awaiting word of the grant award. He stated that an Open Space Grant has been proposed for Hogan Park, he explained what the grant would be for. The letter of intent has been sent and that the public hearing on the grant application will be at the May meeting. He will be attending the Mayor's roundtable meeting to discuss items that are of concern to the town. The budget is being worked on but has not been distributed as yet. He stated that the auditor got word from the state that they were going to move some stuff out of the CAP and there will be a special meeting on Monday, April 29th in order to introduce the 2019 Municipal Budget. He reported that progress is being made with Fair Share Housing and that the Affordable Housing Administrator is working on the manual that the Borough needs. He reported that the funding issues have been resolved. There will be a discussion in closed session this evening with regard to some matters with regard to Affordable Housing.

HEARING OF THE PUBLIC -

<u>Mr. John Hogan - 414 Simon Way</u> – Congratulated the Mayor on the Shared Services Agreement with the Borough of Paramus. He asked how much is the town saving? Mayor Marana stated that it's about \$30,000 per year. Mr. Hogan further complimented the Mayor and stated that he is turning the corner on the budget. He also stated that he had asked last year if the Fair Share Housing Agreement was approved and he was told that it was. He stated that it wasn't and that is a good thing because the Mayor sent it back to the Planning Board and they made some improvements on the plan.

He thanked the Mayor for protecting the residential character of the town by making sure that a proper plan is in place.

Edward Durfee - 215 Livingston Street - Inquired as to what is the commitment from the town on how many properties will need to be provided. Mayor Marana asked that Mr. Durfee leave his contact information as he doesn't have the information with him this evening. Ms. Rosendahl stated that this discussion should be tabled as it will be discussed in closed session this evening. She stated that once the issue is resolved everything will be disclosed to the public.

BOROUGH ENGINEER REPORTS -
