CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER -

Mayor Marana called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building located at 116 Paris Avenue, Northvale, NJ 07647.

STATEMENT -

Mayor Marana read the "Sunshine Statement" into the record as follows:

"This is a Special Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Northvale. The date, time and location of this meeting has been advertised in the official Newspaper of the Borough, filed with the Borough Clerk and posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building. All notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act for this meeting have been fulfilled. Please note the fire exits as required by law at public meetings."

SALUTE TO THE FLAG & SILENT PRAYER -

Mayor Marana asked all in attendance to rise and join him in a Salute to the Flag and then called for a moment of Silent Prayer.

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INTRODUCTION 2019 Municipal Budget (Public Hearing on June 12, 2019)

Mayor Marana stated this is the 10th Borough Budget that he has worked on and has been the most difficult. The biggest challenge has been trying to absorb approximately \$240,000 in unfunded 2018 spending into the 2019 budget and stay within the two 2% CAPS while working with a reduced surplus. The 2nd challenge, besides ducking in under the CAPS, has been to draft a realistic budget that is structurally sound and that will not create problems next year.

Mayor Marana further stated that he did not recall any other year in which the Borough Auditor and the state and, for that matter, the Borough's Bond Council, had to be as involved as this year.

He also did not recall having to create anywhere near as many budget drafts as we've done this year. He also said, regarding our relationship with the state, they're about done with the antics of 2018 and 2019. They want us to get our act together.

Mr. Wielkotz stated that he has done more than 10 budgets here in Northvale and this one has been the most challenging. He stated that due to the complications from last

year, he thought that he would have to go to the state for a CAP waiver. He stated that luckily, it dawned on the state that they had another town that was allowed to borrow the emergency notes after the new year in order to be able to deal with the tax levy CAP. They allowed us to do that. Through some negotiation they approved enough of the emergency's out of the CAP. He stated that the departments were out of control in 2018 and there wasn't enough money in the budget to cover their expenses. This budget took a lot of work to get us to where we are. He stated that this is now a balanced budget. Spending is going up 1.9% (\$134,000) but taxes are going up by 6 ¹/₂% or \$400,000. He stated that on the average assessment for a home in Northvale that the taxes will be going up \$157.00 and that with a small addition for the library tax. He stated that we are going to take all of our short term debt and convert it to permanent financing in order to reduce 2019 Appropriations by \$188,536. He stated that we weren't planning to do it until next year. He has never seen a spread between long term and short term that small. He stated that the State was very kind to us this year. He would like to see the departments have monthly budget reports so that what happened last year, doesn't happen this year. Mr. Wielkotz stated that as long as we can get through the budget this year without having the same issues as last year, we should be good for 2020.

Mr. Wielkotz stated that this is a proforma resolution that we do every year. He stated that it is tied into the cost of living.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Northvale in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2019 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1.00% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$64,814.82 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Northvale, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2019 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Northvale shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 1.00%, amounting to \$64,814.82, and that the CY 2019 municipal

budget for the Borough of Northvale be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Section 1. Purpose and Authority. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend the ordinance to provide for the required abatement of any violation.

Section 2. Amendments. The Northvale Code is hereby amended to provide, as follows [additions highlighted/deletions in strikethrough]:

§ 209-13. Violations. Penalties and Abatement Required. Any person found guilty of violating or refusing to comply with any of the provisions of this article shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$500 for each offense, at the discretion of the Court. It shall be the duty of any owner, tenant, lessee or occupant of any lot, ground, building or house within the limits of the Borough of Northvale, upon notice from the Code Enforcement Officer, Borough Police or Bergen County Board of Health, to forthwith remove therefrom any animal of Classes I, II, III and IV and it shall be the duty of any person, on notice from the Code Enforcement Officer, Borough Police or Bergen County Board of Health to abate any violation of this Code existing on any premises of which he may be the lessee, owner, tenant or occupant. If any person shall neglect or refuse to remove any Class I, II, III and IV animals or if any person shall refuse or neglect to abate and remove any Class I, II, III and IV animals within thirty (30) days of any person found guilty of violating or refusing to comply with any provision of this article, then the Code Enforcement Officer, Borough Police or Bergen County Board of Health, may proceed under the provisions of law and shall remove said animals and shall recover by action of debt the expense incurred by the Borough or the Bergen County Board of Health by such removal.

Section 3. Repealer. All prior ordinances that are inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed. All ordinances are hereby amended to be consistent with this ordinance and all ordinances, including this one, shall be construed consistent with the express purpose of this ordinance.

Section 4. Savings and Construction. This ordinance shall be construed consistent with the purpose stated in Section 1 hereof. Any ambiguities in this ordinance shall be construed in accordance with the purpose of this ordinance. If any part of this ordinance is invalidated by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall be saved to the full extent possible. This ordinance repeals provisions of the Northvale Code only where stated herein; otherwise this ordinance is amendatory and supplementary to existing provision of the Northvale Code.

Section 5. Codification. This ordinance shall be codified as amendments to the chapters set forth herein.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication of notice of adoption as provided by law.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Northvale, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Northvale, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements in, by and for said Borough, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections I and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the State grants and the down payment appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the State grants hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

A. Undertaking of the 2019 Road Improvement Program at various locations, as set forth on a list prepared by the Borough Engineer and placed or to be placed on file with the Borough Clerk. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$80,500 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes,

including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. The aggregate sum of \$383,627 received or to be received as grants from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Livingston Street authorized in Section 4.B hereof.

Section 7. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$17,373, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$17,373 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$330,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 9. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$330,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 10. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 10 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 12. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$330,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 13. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes (other than the State grants hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of such purposes, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized), shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly. Section 14. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 15. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 16. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 17. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.
