Let's Talk About Recycling

By now we all know that recycling is a law in the State of New Jersey. It's not just a suggestion. New Jersey's mandatory recycling law was enacted in 1987. And it requires recycling in the residential, commercial (business) and institutional sectors (schools, hospitals, prisons, etc.).

An important part of recycling is understanding what items can and cannot be recycled.

What do we recycle in Bergen County?

Here is a list of materials you can recycle at home:

- Paper – newspaper, magazines, catalogs, printer paper, school paper, etc.
- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic containers marked #1 and #2
- Aluminum cans
- Steel, scrap, and tin cans
- Corrugated cardboard
- Large appliances (often called "white goods")
- Leaves and grass clippings
- Trash from constructing and tearing down buildings (often called "construction and demolition debris")

It's time to throw out bad recycling habits. It's not enough to just recycle. It's important to recycle right. By taking just a few minutes to recycle right, you help to reduce pollution, contribute to clean water, conserve limited natural resources and reduce the reliance on landfills.

Recycling can be a tricky process that takes practice and education since guidelines are often changing. The recycling symbol, the "chasing arrows" triangle, is misused. Anyone can slap it on their product without it reflecting actual recyclability. Markets change and programs change from place to place. Your plastic soda bottle may have a recycling symbol, but it doesn't know if you're in Bergen County, Texas or California. It can't tell you whether that bottle is recyclable where YOU are located. Each municipality in Bergen County has their own unique recycling program. Therefore, you must learn your local guidelines. It is important to recycle and recycle correctly. If you put recyclable materials in your bin, they will be recycled. If you put trash in the recycling, it will end up in the landfill and ultimately cost money in the long run. And remember the old adage of "when in doubt, throw it out."



BCUA Environmental Awareness Challenge Grant Program for Schools

The BCUA has sponsored the Environmental Awareness Challenge Grant program for schools for the past 16 years. This important program is designed to benefit the environment of Bergen County while educating children of the importance of environmental stewardship.

This program is funded entirely by New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection grant funds specifically allocated for recycling and environmental education. Over \$80,000 was presented to the following 84 schools for the 2023 school year:

Household Hazardous Waste



In 2022, the BCUA conducted eight, one-day household hazardous waste (HHW) management events. These events were held at three different locations throughout Bergen County. In all, Bergen County households took advantage of these events to dispose of 1,024,550 pounds of unwanted hazardous waste materials. These events continue to be the largest attended one-day events in the State of New Jersey.

This popular BCUA program continues this year. All collections are free, but they are open to Bergen County residents only (proof of residency required.) At these HHW drop-offs, we will accept a wide range of chemicals and products used in and around your home. Please keep all items in their original, labeled containers and store them out of reach of children and pets.

No containers, including gasoline and motor oil containers, will be returned, so please plan accordingly. We no longer accept alkaline batteries at the HHW events. Common household batteries with "alkaline" on the label are not classified as hazardous waste and can be safely thrown out in the regular garbage. Also, no computers, electronics, confidential paper, commercial waste or tires will be accepted at these events.

Mobile Paper Shredding

Residents may deliver their confidential paper documents to various locations for on-site shredding. Acceptable documents are limited to confidential and sensitive materials only. Non-confidential materials, such as books, magazines, and newspapers, should be recycled through your local municipal recycling program and will not be accepted. You do not have to remove paper clips, staples, or paperboard binder covers. To accommodate all of those wishing to participate, there is a limit of four (4) bags or boxes of documents weighing no more than 10 pounds each.



The BCUA offers each municipality the opportunity to host a collection event at a municipal site of its choice. In addition, the BCUA sponsors four one-day collection events at two locations in Bergen County. In 2022, 64 municipalities opted to participate in this program and the BCUA hosted four county-wide collection events. Through these programs, the BCUA collected a total of 467,764 pounds of confidential paper for destruction and recycling.

Tire Recycling

Since 1995, the BCUA has sponsored a Municipal Tire Recycling Program. With over 240 million tires being discarded every year, tires take up large amounts of landfill space unnecessarily and present an adverse environmental impact on our solid waste stream.

During 2022, the **BCUA collected 1,405** tires from Bergen County residents for recycling.



FOR RESIDENTS: The BCUA hosts four (4) one-day drop-off events for tire recycling. There is a limit of four tires per participant. Tires with or without rims will be accepted. These events are for Bergen County residents only - no businesses.

Computers and Electronics

During 2022, the **BCUA collected 59,984** pounds (as of 12/14/22) of computer and electronic equipment for recycling from both residents and businesses.



FOR RESIDENTS: Many Bergen County municipalities offer an electronics recycling program so we ask that you contact your local department of Public Works first to see if an electronics recycling program exists in your town. The BCUA operates the Computer and Electronics Recycling Depot for all Bergen County residents at the BCUA, Foot of Empire Blvd., Moonachie. This depot is open Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. The BCUA also hosts 4 (four) one-day drop-off events for Bergen County residents only - no businesses.

FOR BUSINESSES: The Computer and Electronics Recycling Depot accepts equipment from businesses. Contact the BCUA Environmental Programs Hotline at 201-807-5825 for complete details.

BCUA Backyard Composting Program

Composting allows residents the opportunity to turn their yard waste and kitchen scraps into something useful - rich garden soil. This is a form of recycling that can be done from beginning to end in your own backyards. Backyard compost bins turn vegetative kitchen scraps, coffee grinds, tea bags, grass clippings, brown leaves, and dead garden plants into nice crumbly compost. This compost can be used in your vegetable and/or flower gardens.

Compost bins known as “Earth Machines” are available for purchase throughout the year at a reduced price by appointment at the BCUA in Moonachie. Each compost bin comes with a free compost book and is offered at a tremendous discount. Call the BCUA Environmental Programs Hotline: 201-807-5825 to schedule your appointment.

Give your paper a safe retirement – shred it!

Recycle your confidential documents such as, bills, receipts, tax returns, medical records, legal documents, etc. safely by shredding them. (Recycle magazines and non-confidential paper at curbside.)

In an effort to accommodate everyone, there is a limit of four (4) bags/boxes, weighing no more than 10 lbs. each.

Paper clips and staples are acceptable. Please remove binder clips.

Shredding performed immediately on-site.

***Shredding program will end prior to 2pm in the event the shredding trucks reach capacity.

ELECTRONICS & COMPUTERS



Recycle one “byte” at a time – bring us your electronics and computers!

Recycle laptops, monitors, cables, wires, speakers, computers, televisions, stereos, printers, and more!

TIRE RECYCLING



Give your tires one last spin – recycle them!

Four (4) tire limit, per delivery. Tires with or without rims accepted.

UNWANTED MEDICATION



Discard your unwanted and expired over-the-counter and prescription medications in a secured Project Medicine Drop box.

Bring medication in original containers or a sealed bag. **Sharps and liquids will not be accepted.**

You can also dispose of unused and expired medications anonymously, seven days a week, 365 days a year, at “prescription drug drop boxes” located within the headquarters of participating police departments. Turn right off Route 17 South onto Ridgewood Avenue (West) to Paramus Road. Turn left onto Paramus Road and continue approximately two miles to college; proceed around jug handle to main entrance.

From the East

Take Route 4 West to Paramus Road (Paramus Road is $\frac{3}{4}$ miles past Route 17 intersection.) Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north approximately two miles to Bergen Community College entrance on right.

From the South (via Route 17)

Take Route 17 North to Century Road exit, second exit to the right, proceed around cloverleaf over Route 17 onto Century Road (West). Continue to Paramus Road and turn right onto Paramus Road to college entrance on right.

Take Route 4 East to Paramus Road (exit under overpass). Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north for approximately two miles to college entrance on right.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS FOR WASTE COLLECTIONS

- Any business or commercial generated waste
- Empty containers or hardened paint cans are garbage
- Alkaline batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, 9V) dispose in normal trash
- Unlabeled waste or containers with unknown contents
- Regulated medical waste, sharps, radioactive materials, and explosives
- Containers larger than five (5) gallons
- Any compressed cylinders (e.g. oxygen or acetylene)
- Pressure-treated lumber or railroad ties
- Computers, electronics, and tires are NOT accepted at waste collections.
- Smoke Detectors
- Construction/demolition debris

Turn right off Route 17 South onto Ridgewood Avenue (West) to Paramus Road. Turn left onto Paramus Road and continue approximately two miles to college; proceed around jug handle to main entrance.

From the East

Take Route 4 West to Paramus Road (Paramus Road is ¾ miles past Route 17 intersection.) Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north approximately two miles to Bergen Community College entrance on right.

From the South (via Route 17)

Take Route 17 North to Century Road exit, second exit to the right, proceed around cloverleaf over Route 17 onto Century Road (West). Continue to Paramus Road and turn right onto Paramus Road to college entrance on right.

From the West

Take Route 4 East to Paramus Road (exit under overpass). Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north for approximately two miles to college entrance on right.

Traveling Route 17 North
